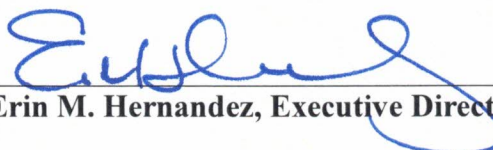

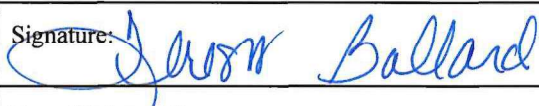

Residents accumulate old tires and this event gives them an opportunity to dispose of them properly and low/no cost.

The overall objective is to promote removal of old tires from properties to keep the community's residential properties clean of old tires for sanitary and safety reasons as they can provide habitat for rodents, snakes and bugs.

The waste stream projected for this particular project is used tires that are not easily disposed of in the community.

The customer incentive is a low/no cost disposal of old tires that have accumulated in Mason.

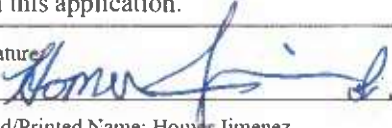

1. Why is the proposed project needed?

As a small rural community with limited resources, we continue to encounter challenges associated with litter accumulation, illegal dumping, and the improper disposal of bulky waste items. These conditions negatively impact our public health, public safety, environmental quality, and the visual appearance of our city. Cleanup efforts place an ongoing financial burden on the City's limited resources and staff. The proposed project is needed to provide residents with legal and accessible disposal opportunities, remove existing waste from public areas, and reduce future occurrences of illegal dumping through cleanup efforts, public outreach, and community engagement.

2. State the overall goal or objective of the project:

The goal of this project is to reduce litter and illegal dumping within the City of Rocksprings through ongoing cleanup activities and quarterly community collection events. The City seeks to provide convenient disposal opportunities for residents, encourage responsible waste management practices, and improve the cleanliness, safety, and appearance of our community while protecting our local natural resources and green areas.

3. Identify waste stream targeted by the project:

This project will target municipal solid waste generated by residents, including household bulky waste, furniture, appliances, construction and demolition debris from residential sources, illegally dumped waste, roadside litter, and other discarded materials collected during cleanup efforts. 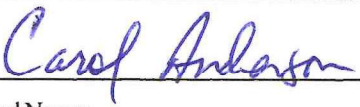

1. Why is the proposed project needed?

Menard County currently does not have an efficient method to deal with illegal dumping, regular flood damage, and debris clean-up in our county.

2. State the overall goal or objective of the project:

To remove flood damage and debris on our county low water crossings, illegal dumping around our parks, and clear the right-of-way of unwanted trees and vegetation for the traveling public.

3. Identify waste stream targeted by the project:

The main source of waste is illegal dumping. Also when the river floods we have debris build-up and trash accumulation in different parts of the county. We also have 131 miles of right-of-way that needs to be cleared of vegetation and trash to make safe for the citizens of Menard.

4. Customer incentives, public education, or public input included in the project:

If awarded we intend to communicate in the local newspaper and social media, the purpose of the hydraulic dove tail trailer and multiple bobcat attachments and will solicit feedback from other community organizations about appropriate uses and beautification efforts.

5. Feasibility or workability of the project. If the project includes the purchase of equipment, demonstrate its importance to the overall objective of the project:

The project involves the purchase of a 38 foot hydraulic dove tail trailer to haul our bobcat and attachments around the county to areas that need attention. A 50in Fecon bull hog standard flow mulcher, brush monkey 2-blade brush cutter and 8k/lb IDT pallet forks to help clean up our right-of-way. With these items we can transport our resources to dump sites and beautify Menard County.

This project would allow Menard County to transport our bobcat all over the county to remove debris, illegal dumping, flood damage and the multiple attachments. Additionally these tools will allow us to increase visibility on our rights-of-way from encroaching trees and vegetation to make it safer for the traveling public.
